Royal Parks PCN

The surgery is part of the Royal Parks Primary Care Network (PCN) working collaboratively with neighbouring surgeries to serve the needs of our patient communities.

Practice area

The Practice area covers an approximate 2 mile radius of the surgery.

How to register as a patient

You can register using the NHS App, online at www.langhamplacesurgery.co.uk, and you can also enquire at the Reception desk in order to register as a patient.

Doctor availability

There are a range of appointments available across the week. This is both for urgent and routine appointments. You can book in person, on the telephone, online at: www.langhamplacesurgery.co.uk, or using the NHS App.

Chaperones

The surgery has trained chaperones who can attend your appointment with you, please enquire at reception if you would like more information or to view a copy of the surgery's chaperone policy, which is also available on our website at www.langhamplacesurgery.co.uk.

Community Pharmacy

Your local pharmacy is now offering clinical advice and treatment for more conditions than ever before. You can now get care for a variety of minor illnesses including urinary tract infections (UTIs) and some skin infections, as well as blood pressure checks and oral contraception.

Results of investigations

You can check your results using the NHS App. If calling for results, please ring the surgery after 11.00am. It is important that you check the results of any tests or investigations you have had done. Please do not assume the result is normal.

Repeat prescriptions

Repeat prescriptions can be requested using the NHS App, or our online service at: www.langhamplacesurgery.co.uk, in person, or by post. Please allow 48 hours (excluding weekends and bank holidays) for standard repeat items, 72 hours for items not authorised on repeat and at least a week for postal prescriptions (SAE to be enclosed). We use the electronic prescription service (EPS). Please ask reception for details

Please note we do not accept prescription requests over the phone.

Home visits

Home visits are made when the doctor feels it is necessary on medical grounds. You can greatly assist by attending the surgery whenever possible. If you are too ill to come to the surgery, please try to telephone before 11:30am. Please give as much detail as possible about the problem so the doctor can judge how urgent the visit is.

Minor Surgery

The doctors carry out some minor surgical procedures at the practice. Please ask the Doctor for advice.

Practice Nurses

Practice Nurse appointments can be pre booked for the following: Chronic disease management clinics (e.g. diabetes, asthma and coronary heart disease), family planning advice, smears, weight management, ear syringing, travel advice, injections and smoking cessation advice.

Health Care Assistants

Our Health Care Assistants undertake: Blood pressure checks, ECGs, blood tests, urine tests, general health checks - MOT's, new patient checks and weight monitoring.

Community Nursing Team

The District Nurses may be contacted for advice by telephoning 0300 7770002 between 8.00am and 10.00pm.

Out of these hours please dial 111 to speak to the NHS 111 service. The District Nurses also offer information and support for the elderly and for carers.

We have a Lead GP for Carers and a Care Coordinator at the Practice

Maternity Medical Services

Maternity medical services are provided by each doctor in conjunction with a Community Midwife. Arrangements are made for delivery in the GP Unit at Northampton General Hospital. Please enquire about antenatal appointments.

Health Visitors

You may speak to the team by phoning the Central Hub on 0300 1111022 between 9.00am and 5.00pm.

Social Prescribing Link Workers

The PCN provides a social prescribing service who can help people improve their health and wellbeing by connecting them with non-medical sources of support in their community. Please contact reception for more information or if you would like to be referred.

Physiotherapy

The PCN provides a first contact physiotherapy service (FCPs) who are experienced musculoskeletal (MSK) physiotherapists who work in GP practices or primary care. Instead of first seeing a GP for issues like joint, back, or muscle pain, patients can book directly with an FCP.

Health Checks

These are available for all patients. For those aged 75 or over, where owing to a medical condition it would be impossible to attend the surgery; this can be undertaken at home.

Special Services available

Services outside the scope of the NHS are available on request but will attract a fee.

Disabled access and parking

Wheelchair access can be gained from the rear of the building where we also have parking spaces for patients with physical disabilities. General patient parking is at the front. You may park immediately outside the front of the building after 9:30am, where access is possible with assistance. Please inform reception in advance if you feel you may need help on arrival.

There are facilities for patients on three floors (lower, ground and first floor). A lift is available for the lower floor but the first floor may only be accessed via a staircase. Please inform reception if you have difficulty with stairs.

Volunteer transport service

There is a community transport service provided by volunteers. It is for medically related problems for elderly and disabled people who live in the borough of Northampton and who cannot manage public services. There is a small charge and transport must be arranged at least 2 days before you want to travel. For more information, please telephone 01604 628234 between 9:00am and 12 noon on weekdays.

Research
